

## Intro


Hypothesis: People with larger hands tend to type faster

#### Data Collection-Sample Space


- Stratified random sample by grade and gender
  - Representative of our school population
  - RNG to choose students
- Convenience Sample
  - Mainly juniors and seniors
- Randomized surveyors
  - Minimize response bias



Data Collection-Tools

- Monkey Type
- 30 Second timed test





### Data Collection-Tools

**WPM** (Word per Minute)-The total amount of characters in the correctly typed words including spaces, divided by 5 and normalized to 60 seconds.


Raw WPM – Calculated just like WPM, but also includes incorrect words

Accuracy – The percentage of correctly pressed keys

**Consistency** – Based on the variance of your raw wpm. Closer to 100% is better. Calculated using the coefficient of variation of raw wpm and mapped onto a scale of 0 to 100.

#### Data Collection -Methods

- Hand length, hand span, thumb length
  - Centimeters
- Monkeytype


Conducting a proper survey

Response bias, nonresponse bias, voluntary response bias, convenience bias, undercoverage bias


Data Collectionunexpected difficulties


- Time constraints

#### Data Analysis (continued)






Personal vs. Control

- As expected, people did better on their personal laptops
- Y=x line graphed

### Conclusions

- No correlation :(
- Typing speed is a learned skill, not a natural one
- People with smaller hands can sometimes type faster than people with bigger hands
